Are You Seeing the Full Picture of Your Threat Exposure?

Check all th	nat apply. If you're skipping boxes, you're probably skipping risk.
	You have a real-time view of your full attack surface. That means internal, external, cloud, SaaS, shadow IT, forgotten domains all of it.
	You know which assets are internet-facing—and why. If you don't know what's public, you don't know what's vulnerable.
	You have visibility into third-party integrations and inherited risk. Vendors and APIs expand your surface fast. CTEM makes that visible before it becomes exploitable.
	You track changes to your environment that could introduce new risk. New apps, misconfigurations, expansion into new geos—risk doesn't just arrive, it evolves.
	You understand how an attacker would prioritize your environment. CTEM isn't about theory—it's about seeing what looks valuable to an attacker from the outside in.
	You get regular reporting on exposure—not just alerts. Point-in-time scanning is a start. But risk is a moving target. You need a pulse, not a snapshot.
	You've correlated vulnerabilities with actual business impact. Which assets, if compromised, would really hurt? Without that context, patching becomes guesswork.
	You've had a breach, scare, or incident tied to an unknown or misclassified asset. If it's happened, you already know why CTEM matters.
